

Digitoll Effective from February 1st 2026

Starting February 1st 2026, the Norwegian Customs will introduce Digitoll in Norway. From this date, all imports into Norway must be pre-registered.

The current system of direct delivery, where goods can be transported directly to the recipient and declared up to 10 days after crossing the border, will be discontinued on 1.2.2026. This change affects companies that currently use the existing system for importing goods into Norway. Pre-registration must be electronically submitted to Norwegian Customs via a manifest system, which Bring will handle before border crossing. Digitoll may entail additional work and costs for companies that need to adapt their systems and processes to meet these requirements.

What does this mean for importers of goods into Norway?

Documentation requirements will become stricter. The following documents must be available latest at the moment of collection:

- Commercial invoices
- Export documentation
- Any permits and certificates

Incomplete documentation may lead to delays and additional costs at the border.

Purpose of Digitoll:

• Efficient border crossings:

Digitoll enables automated and more efficient border crossings. Declarants must provide digital information well before arrival, allowing Norwegian Customs to assess risks before vehicles and shipments reach the border.

Combating illegal trade:

Digitoll helps prevent illegal trade and promotes fair competition.

Protecting society:

Digitoll contributes to safeguarding society against threats to health, the environment, and public safety.
